

Because this book was written by a mother and son team, it satisfies both sensibilities. It is not preachy, nor rebellious, but exemplifies the delicate cooperation that exists when kids grow up and want to have more rights, but also need to earn their rights by exhibiting a firm understanding of what they are getting themselves into. "Driving" is perhaps the greatest symbol of that shift in responsibility and freedom, as parents stop driving their kids around, and kids take the wheel and make many more decisions about where they are going. This is a great book, a wonderful graduation book for a high school senior. Should be required reading for all who attend driving school too.
