

It was almost as though my teacher was in the room guiding me. It also makes a great quick reference. Pictures are clear, directions are written in a manner that speaks to every level of weaver. A must have for your weaving library!

The author is excellent at explaining things in easy to understand terms and sequences. she also includes diagrams and real life photos, which are extremely helpful. Her writing is very easy to read and understand and follow. It explains all of the many new concepts, and with careful reading and taking my time, consulting the book each step of the way, I was actually able to warp my loom and begin weaving without any hands-on help at all... It is clearly written, assumes that you know nothing, and builds your skills in an orderly way. I recommend it to all first-time weavers - and even to people who have woven before, since you may discover tricks that make your weaving much nicer and more satisfying.
