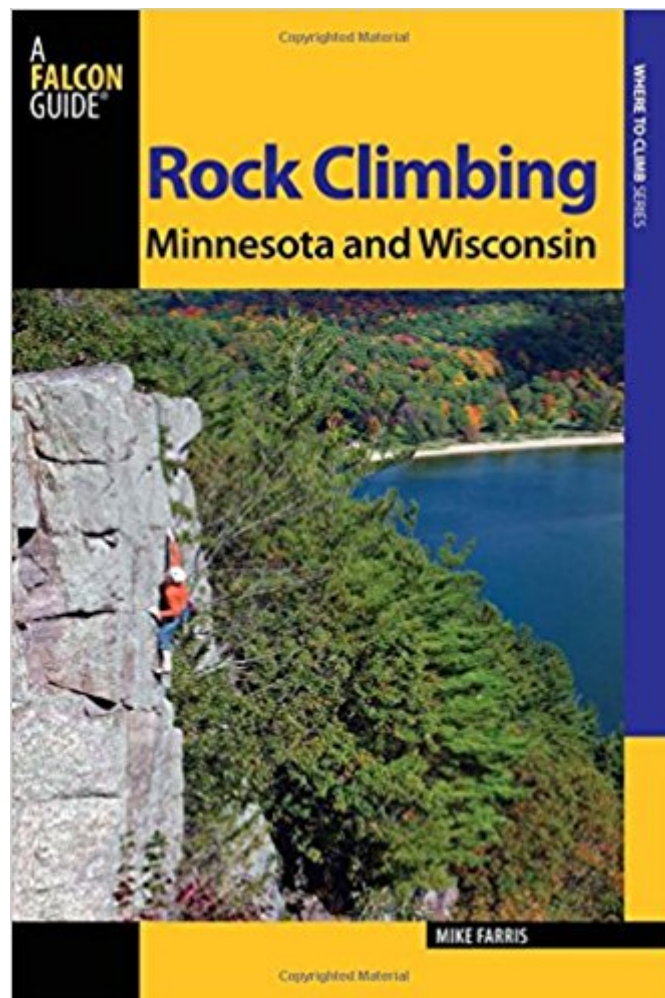




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# Rock Climbing Minnesota And Wisconsin (State Rock Climbing Series)

This updated and revised edition of *Rock Climbing Minnesota and Wisconsin* describes almost 1,000 routes at 13 major areas, offering a lifetime of cragging entertainment for beginners and experts alike. Experience the distinctive sea-cliff atmosphere of climbing along the North Shore of Lake Superior; cling to solid quartzite routes at Devil's Lake and Blue Mounds State Parks; revel in the Northwoods environment of Mystical Mountain and Carlton Peak; or push your limits on steep sport routes at Barn Bluff and Willow River. Maps, color topos, and stunning action photos accompany clearly written descriptions of the routes to make *Rock Climbing Minnesota and Wisconsin* an indispensable component on your next Midwestern climbing adventure.

Mike Farris is a college professor who teaches upper-level seminars on high-altitude human biology at Hamline University in Minnesota. He is an experienced high-altitude climber who has climbed extensively throughout North and South America and the Himalayas. He is also the author of *The*

The book is great at describing climbing locations throughout Wisconsin and Minnesota. Most locations are at the boarder though Devil's Lake and Blue Mounds are also included. The book is excellent at describing how to get to a climbing location and uses natural landmarks where necessary. It also describes local ethics while at each location in order for climbers to maintain a good relationship with the public and park staff so that we can continue to use the cliffs required for our sport. The book does not contain any bouldering recommendations. This is a list of the most popular climbing locations in Minnesota and Wisconsin not an exhaustive list. For that I recommend mountainproject.com or the app. However the book does function better at the crag than any phone ever will.
