

I loved this book. I will be honest. Before I opened this book, I already had it in my head that it was going to be boring. But I had read Shawn's other books so I figured I could power through it. However, to my great surprise, the book drew me in immediately and I ended up finishing it less than 24 hours after I started. He is a master storyteller and knows how to weave in anecdotes that complement the story he is trying to tell. There were a few times I laughed out loud as I was reading. reflections on his past trips to Alaska and how he sees it now. Shawn is a great writer, but I think he is at his best when writing non-fiction. With all the pictures, which I loved, there wasn't space for a map but that would have been nice to see his "lap" on a map. Read this if you want to know about the "non-commercial" Alaska, you get to read about parts of Alaska and Canada you probably won't see on the Travel Channel but you should.

If you ever plan to make a trip in Alaska, I would strongly advise you read this book. You will be prepared for the changes in culture and temperatures so they will not surprise you unpleasantly, you will be able to enjoy them as Shawn Inmon did. He is forever open to new vistas, and the many beautiful photos in this book show the variety of scenery and wildlife that his keen eyes grabbed for us. As he describes them I actually feel like tasting the pureness of the air, feeling the pricking of the cold on my skin. Then there are different sights out of the ordinary, and there are the special Alaska people that Shawn describes with interest and affection. Had I not read his daily blog posts during the trip, I might have been more amazed. Still I would never have seen the sign post for the Arctic Circle (among other things) if not for this book, so I am real grateful.

Following in his earlier footsteps, Shawn takes us north this time in a large loop around America's largest state: Alaska. Even traversing a road or two that you may have even seen on the series, "Ice Road Truckers," Shawn gets off the beaten path to discover the awesome natural beauty of our 50th state. Complete with a healthy compliment of great pictures, Shawn takes us day-by-day, mile-by-mile as he discovers the wonders of Alaska and her people. During the trip he reminisces of several teenage summers spent with his older brother doing commercial fishing, and re-visits the place to drink in the familiar sights from those times. While I am not usually a fan of non-fiction for leisure reading, I have to admit that Shawn's tales held me every bit as riveted as a grand galactic challenge in my favorite Sci-Fi literature. This book is well worth your time to download and indulge in!

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
