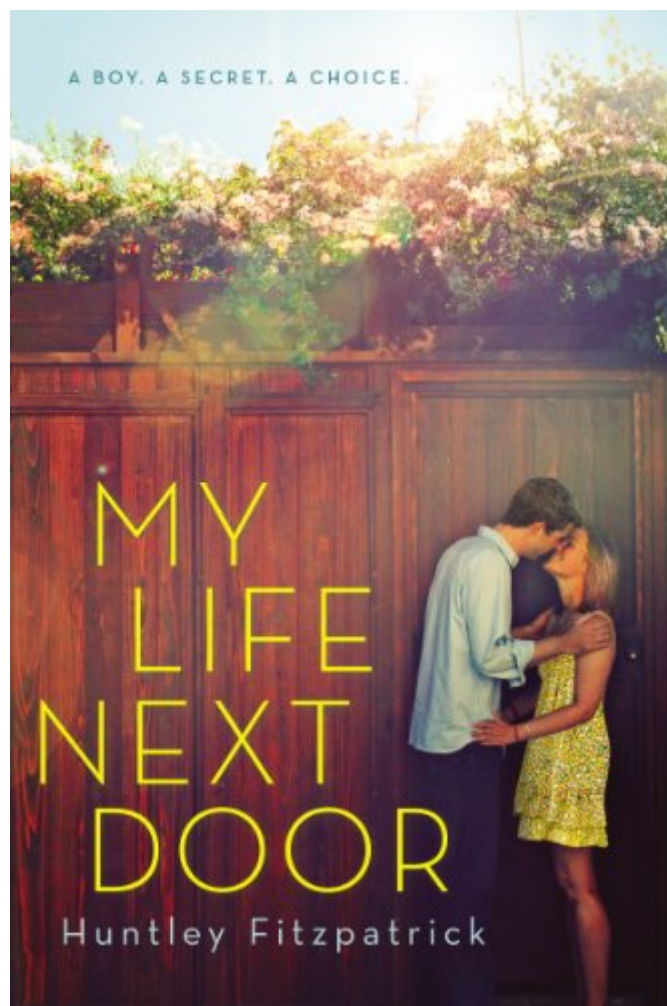


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My Life Next Door

I'm generally not big on YA contemps but I wanted to read something "light and fluffy" to kick off my

summer reading. This book had been highly recommended on booklr and I picked it up as a start to a summer traveling book project. I really loved this book. First Impression: Extremely well-written, fantastic characterization and setting descriptions.

I absolutely adore this book. *My Life Next Door* by Huntley Fitzpatrick reminds me of my own youth, the hopes and dreams I used to have, the moments I shared with friends and family, the way I used to stargaze and think about this vast world that seemed so much bigger than me. This book was to read the first time and it was every bit as good the second time around. The narrator, Amy Rubinate, did a fantastic job giving life to Sam and the other characters in the story.
