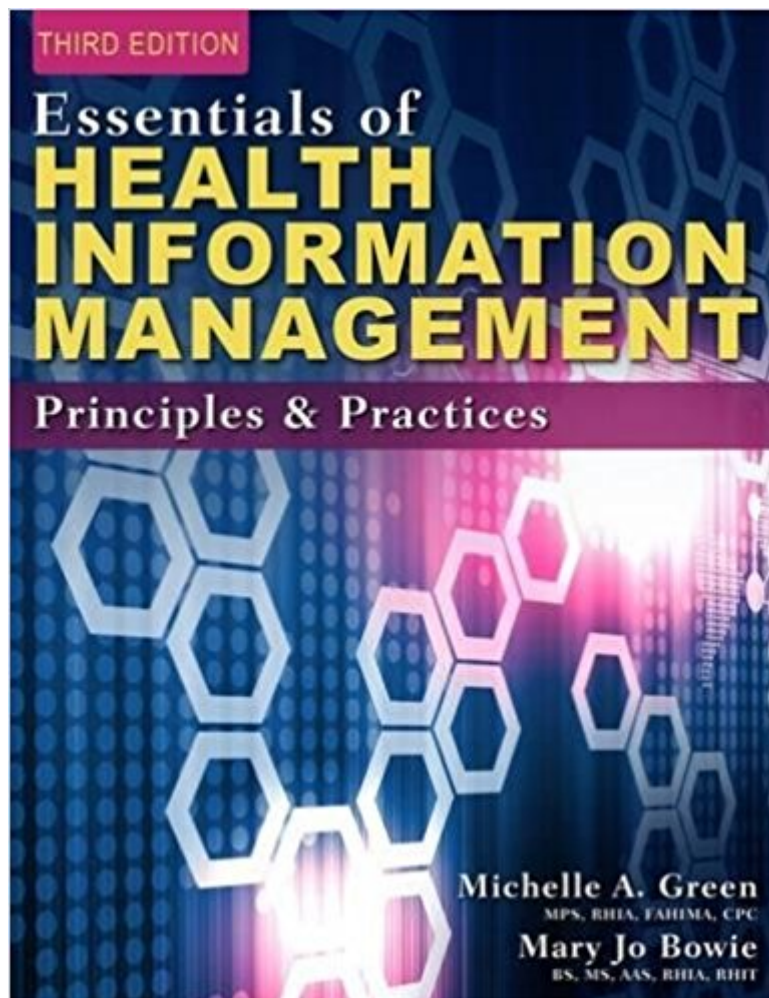

There's appears to be an widespread issue with the CD that comes with this book. In my current class we were supposed to use it regularly, but found out that we couldn't because only 1 person in my class actually had a cd that worked. It is not "operator's error" I assure you. The executable file is corrupt, therefore the program will never install. And, when I contacted the seller about this they sent me another cd, after much inconvenience. AND, the second cd also had the same problem. Also, the cd's come already scratched and/or foggy on the bottom. Not sure how this is being allowed, but very frustrating. Especially since I am supposed to use this book for another class next quarter and we're going to have to go through this all over again...in reference to my teacher realizing nobody can use their cd. I called the publisher's customer service and they forwarded me to tech support, although if you know anything about computers, you know that if the executable file is corrupt, no tech support can fix that. So, then tech support said they couldn't do anything for me since they hadn't gotten any memos stating this was a widespread problem. That's probably due to

the fact that most students don't have the time nor the energy to make numerous phone calls only to get no resolution.

I am highly disappointed at the 'gently used quality' which is more like a third hand not even second hand book. I do not like the quality at all. That is why I always prefer buying my books brand new. I will return it as soon as possible and get a new one instead. Thank you.

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
